Busted was originally published by Glimmer Train Stoires (in it's 2nd edition!), was recorded for the National Public Radio program "Selected Shorts," and appears in the novel Heathens, published by New Rivers in 1996.

Congratulations to all of Dr. McElroy's students for last night's wonderful performances, and thanks also to the Master of Liberal Studies program at SMU for their continued support of her important work. Special shout out to Michael Counter, Michelle Jenkins, Sarah Weatherford and William Searcy for bringing Ali, Verda, Ione and Principal Smutts to life so vividly.
